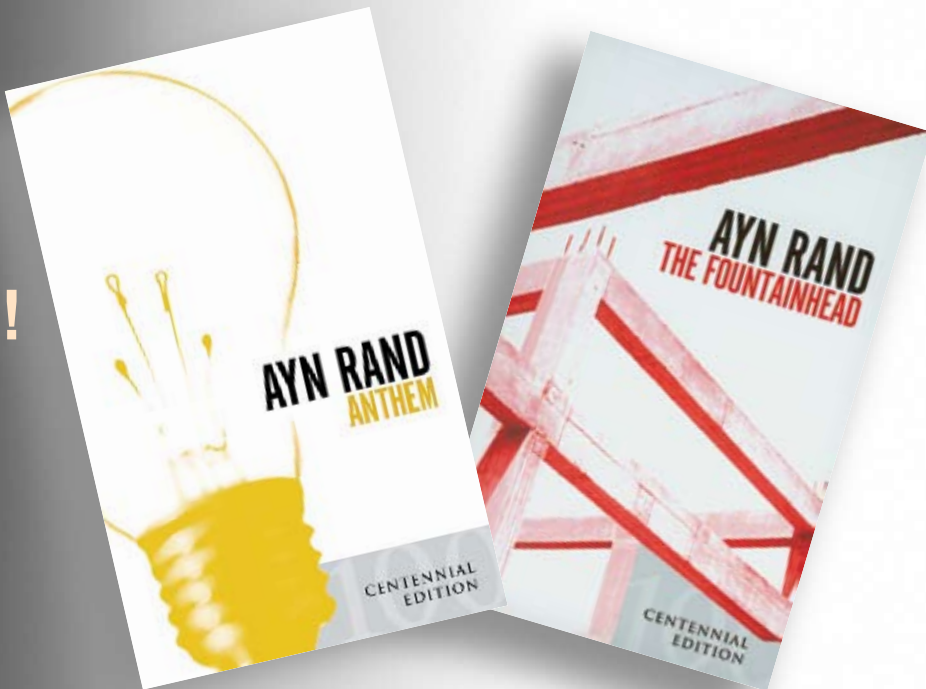

This novelette depicts a dark world of the future, a society so collectivized that even the word "I" has vanished from the language—and one man's defiance of that society. *Anthem's* theme is: the meaning and glory of man's ego. *Anthem* is appropriate for grades 9 and 10.

The Fountainhead

The Fountainhead is the story of an innovative, uncompromisingly independent architect, Howard Roark, and his battle against a tradition-worshipping society. Its theme is: "individualism versus collectivism, not in politics, but in man's soul." Ayn Rand presented here for the first time her projection of an ideal man. *The Fountainhead* is appropriate for grades 11 and 12.

Anthem and *The Fountainhead* both contain many elements that appeal strongly to young readers. They are inspiring and exciting stories, with heroic characters fighting for their ideals. The novels portray events with profound, timeless significance, challenging readers to decide not just what will happen to particular characters, but what their own lives and the world should be like.

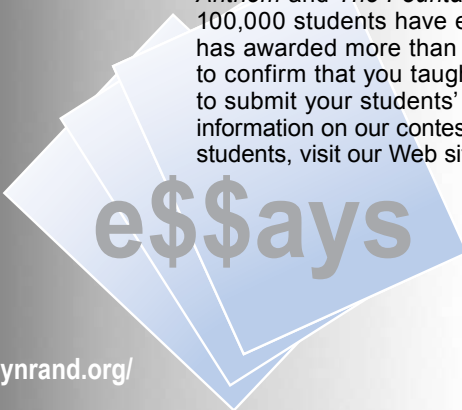
Essay Contests
